Garment construction of 1860-1900 trousers, 1900-1940 trousers and 1990's Patrol Officer blazer.

Collaboration with bespoke leathergoods brand Lauren Broxton; I was tasked as a garment technology student with bringing 4 garments deprived from her 2019 collection 'Pathology of Man', into fruition. Pattern drafted and constructed to perfection throughout a series of fit sessions and sampling, this graduate collection highlights my introduction to the world of leather craft. All fabric was tested accordingly to assess final garment care codes required for sustainable aftercare. Due to the high standards of all samples produced, I was offered a place in London Graduate Fashion Week 2024 to present the garments I created for this collaboration, being the first Garment Technician from Birmingham City University to receive a place.

Research fashion history of men's tailoring, focusing on styles synonymous to the 1920's to correctly source fabric and trimmings. Fabric is tested accordingly to create final garment care codes, ensuring correct aftercare.
